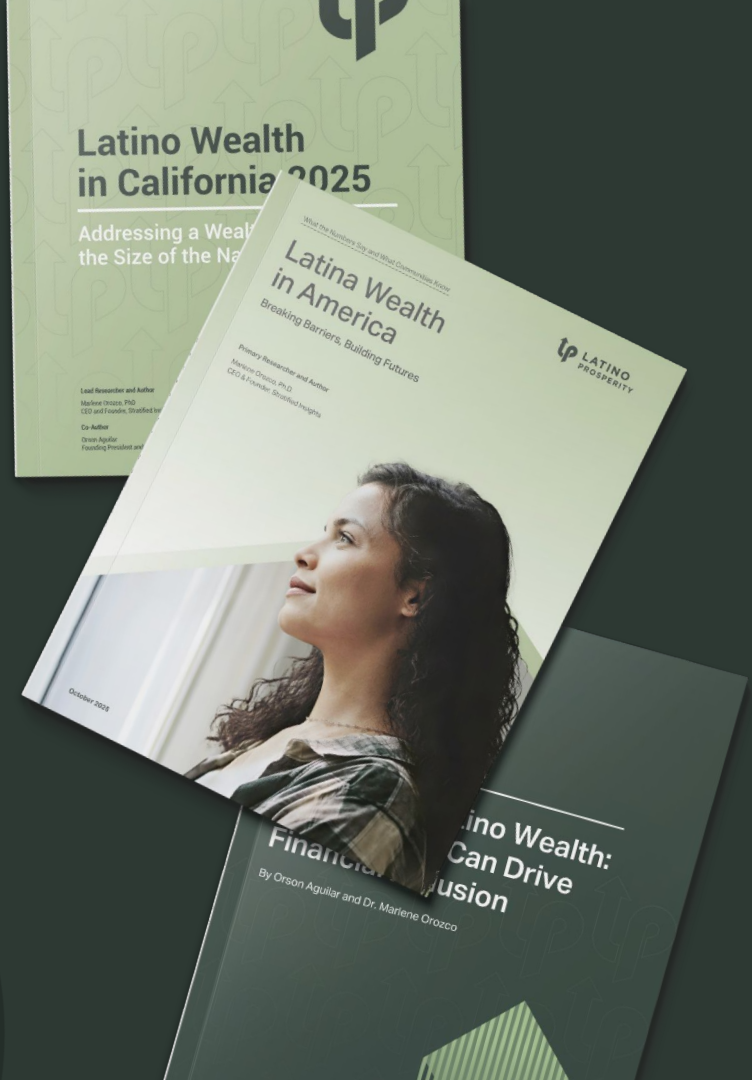

We published three flagship reports: *Latina Wealth in America* (released at the U.S. Capitol), *Latino Wealth in California* (documenting that Latino families hold just one-tenth the wealth of White households), and *Unlocking Latino Wealth: How Fintech Can Drive Financial Inclusion*. We also completed rigorous analysis of home mortgage lending to Latinos in California for release in early 2026.

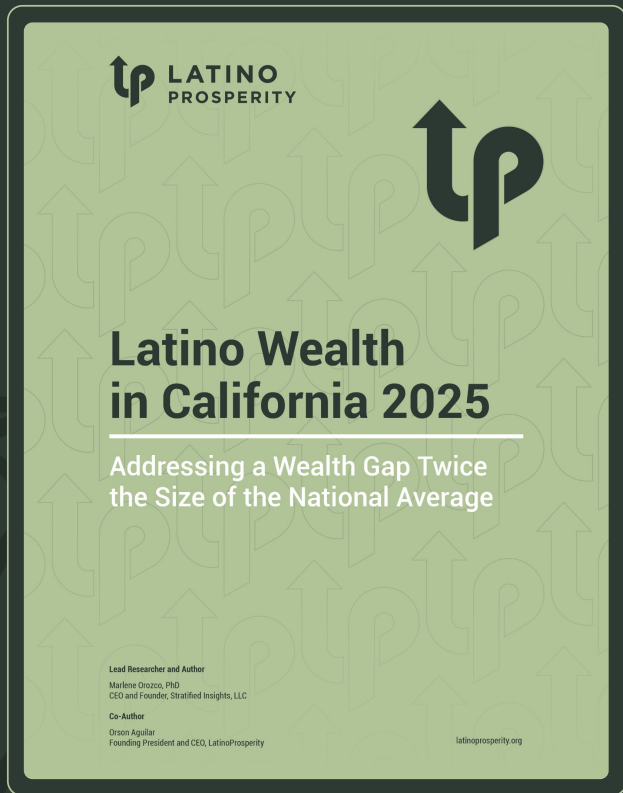

REPORT 01

Latina Wealth in America

Latina Wealth in America was Latino Prosperity's flagship report in 2025, documenting a fundamental truth: Latinas are doing everything right—working, caregiving, earning degrees, and starting businesses—yet systemic inequities continue to block wealth-building opportunities. We were honored to release the report at the U.S. Capitol alongside House Minority Whip Katherine Clark (D-MA), elevating its findings before federal leaders and underscoring the urgency of addressing these persistent barriers to economic mobility. A follow-up report, A National Latina Economic Opportunity Agenda, will be released in early 2026. We deeply appreciate the Eva Longoria Foundation's support of this research.

Latino Wealth in California Report

Our Latino Wealth in California report documents the scale and drivers of California’s Latino-White wealth gap, showing that Latino families, who fuel much of the state’s growth, hold just one-tenth the wealth of White households, posing a serious risk to long-term economic stability. Using data on wealth, income, homeownership, entrepreneurship, and retirement security, the report provides a clear, evidence-based picture of where disparities are widest and most consequential.

“Latino households in California hold just 11% of the wealth of their White counterparts—a wealth gap far exceeding the national figures.”

Unlocking Latino Wealth: How Fintech Can Drive Financial Inclusion

Unlocking Latino Wealth: How Fintech Can Drive Financial Inclusion revealed that Latinos are enthusiastic adopters of digital financial tools, but without intentional design informed by our lived experiences, these technologies risk repeating the same injustices we've long faced in traditional banking. This research made clear that innovation must listen to and learn from our communities, not simply deploy technology and hope for equitable outcomes.

Community Voice at the Center

We held Pláticas (listening sessions) across California and Texas, engaging over 200 community leaders who shaped our strategic direction. Community leaders called for focus on homeownership, entrepreneurship, financial health, and AI's impact on Latino futures, challenging us to move beyond deficit narratives toward empowerment.

Local realities must inform state and national policy, and Latinos must be decision-makers, not just participants.



Rapid Response When Crisis Hits

When the Eaton Fire devastated communities and ICE enforcement intensified, we launched the Immigrant Relief Fund, raising \$55,000 to provide direct cash assistance to families facing displacement and emergency expenses.

Our assistance has offered dignity and trust at a moment when many felt abandoned.

Leading with Coalition Building

We co-founded and co-led Eyes on OpenAI, a coalition of over 60 organizations demanding accountability as OpenAI attempted to privatize its charitable assets. Our pressure made OpenAI reverse course and remain a nonprofit. OpenAI made \$50 million in grants to California nonprofits and is now the largest charity in the U.S., valued at \$130 billion.

Launching a Latino AI Resilience Initiative to prepare and protect Latino communities in an AI-driven economy.

05 Immigration and Economic Prosperity

Publishing a report reframing immigration enforcement as an economic issue and elevating Latino-led cash transfer and mutual aid strategies.

06 Latino Homeownership

Advancing a national strategy to expand Latino homeownership through reformed mortgage access, increased housing supply, and strengthened local ecosystems.

07 Accountability Advocacy

Holding key stakeholders accountable on Latino wealth issues when Latino communities face attacks, neglect, and underrepresentation.
